Earlier in her career, Todd served as Associate Counsel to President George W. Bush and was a partner in the appellate, litigation, and communications practices of a Washington, D.C.-based law firm. She taught the law of federal courts at The George Washington University Law School for numerous years and constitutional law at Cornell University's Washington program.

Todd served as a law clerk to Associate Justice Clarence Thomas of the Supreme Court of the United States and to Judge J. Michael Luttig of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. She graduated *magna cum laude* from Harvard Law School, where she was executive editor of the *Harvard Law Review*. She received her undergraduate degree in government, history, and international relations from Cornell University.
